INTRODUCTION

The Future Project has a simple mandate—to build empowered citizens across Africa, through (inclusive) enterprise and (active) citizenship. This focus on Human Capital Development is informed by our value proposition: Africa's growth needs a generation of young people who are gainfully employed and able to demand better leadership.

This quarter, one of TFP's goal is to train the young people through our structured trainings (Online and offline). Projects held this quarter includes Aiki.ng, an employability portal resented with Microsoft; Code2earn, TFP Volunteer Environmental Sustainability (Celebration of Children's day), The Future Enterprise Support Scheme and African Citizenship School.

Targeting primarily young people between the ages of 16 to 40 years, TFP is guided by a Strategic Plan from which it derives its annual and quarterly work-plan. This report therefore highlights implementation reports comprising overview of implemented activities and results achieved for the second quarter which will lead us towards achieving our goal for 2016.

Founded by Chude Jideonwo and Adebola Williams, TFP is supervised by a Global Board of Advisors drawn from Africa, Europe, North America and the Middle East.

2.0.1 Enterprise Development and Employability

The enterprise development thematic area seeks to develop where imperative and also strengthen the capacity of young people in Africa towards positive contribution to the economic and social growth. To this end, the following activities were programmed for implementation in the quarter under review.

AIKI NIGERIA CONTINUES 'CODE2EARN' TRAINING. VISITS MORE LOCATIONS

Aiki Nigeria has visited more states to train young people on Coding.

Technology has played a role in raising income and driving employment opportunities in developing countries, and there is a huge demand for IT programmers in a rapidly growing economy. Code2earn training held in five more locations – Ijebu-ode, Owerri, Ondo, Abuja and Oyo. In total, the project has trained 11,892.







THE FUTURE ENTERPRISE SUPPORT SCHEME

This quarter, The Future Enterprise Support Scheme organised three (3) trainings. In total, TFESS trained 73people this quarter:

- Young Writers' Network
- Graphics Design workshop
- Digital Marketing Master class

Young Writers' Network: The Future Enterprise Support Scheme (TFESS) held a writers workshop with the aim of improving the skills of attendants, regardless of their level of knowledge. The workshop was targeted at young and aspiring writers who want to equip themselves with practical lessons, while engaging our seasoned facilitators.







TFESS GRAPHICS DESIGN WORKSHOP: The Future Enterprise Support Scheme (TFESS) in partnership with design agency, FourthCanvas held a 5-day graphics design where interested participants can develop themselves as graphics designers.



TFESS DIGITAL MARKETING MASTERCLASS: The Future Enterprise Support Scheme (TFESS) held a 3-day master class for participants interested in acquiring the digital marketing skills needed to drive their career and stay ahead of the competition while engaging customers.



THE FUTURE PROJECT PARTNERS WITH THE ZARIAH ELIZABETH FOUNDATION TO TRAIN 6000 STUDENTS ACROSS 10 SECONDARY SCHOOLS ON CODING IN ABUJA.

The Future Project partnered with TZE Foundation to train 6000 students across 10 secondary schools in Abuja in collaboration with the Ministry of Education which started on the 13th of May, 2016.

2.0.2 Governance and Leadership

The goal of TFP's governance and leadership programming is to ensure young people are adequately informed and are equipped with decision-making skills. In facilitating achievement of the goal, the organisation recognises the importance of identifying with and celebrating young people already demonstrating remarkable leadership skills in their chosen field and also achieving results. The program also focuses on facilitating young people's active, response and informed participation in governance in the country.

Below are activities implemented during the period under review:

AFRICAN CITIZENSHIP SCHOOL

The 2nd edition of the African Citizenship School held on Friday, 13 May, 2016 at Oto Awori local government, Ijaniki, Badagry, Lagos.

The program is put together to help young students to be aware of their rights as citizens in a democracy and the hugely important role young people hold in shaping the future of the continent. For this edition, TFAA alumni, Denrele Edun (winner TFAA Prize for Producer of the year 2007), Tolulope Sangosanya (winner TFAA Prize for Best Use of Advocacy 2010), and Ukinebo Dare (winner TFAA price for The Ford Foundation Prize for Youth Employment); were present to share insightful and thought provoking words with the students.

Five schools were represented:

- Flavids College, Agbara, Badagry.
- Damtops International Secondary School, Morogbo, Badagry.
- Adeniyi Goodwill School, Ijaniki, Badagry.
- Great Citizen School, Blueshield Crescent Mebamu, Badagry.
- Inspiration Academy

The tour kicked off in Abeokuta earlier this year.








AIKI QUIZ
