1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Future Project has a simple mandate - to build empowered citizens across Africa, through (inclusive) enterprise and (active) citizenship. This focus on Human Capital Development is informed by our value proposition: Africa's growth needs a generation of young people who are gainfully employed and able to demand better leadership.

Our projects include Aiki.ng, an employability portal presented with Microsoft; the Nigeria Symposium for Young & Emerging Leaders, #StartupsAfrica, Intern4Jobs, The m-Hub, The Future Enterprise Support Scheme and The Future Africa Awards & Summit, described as 'The Nobel Prize for Young Africans'.

With a network of funders and partners including the Tony Elumelu Foundation, the US Government, First Bank, MTN, HP, the Nigerian Government and the British Council, our work has spanned Nigeria, Ghana, South Africa, Tanzania, Liberia, Burkina Faso, Uganda, Malawi, Cameroon, Somalia, Equitorial Guinea, Ivory Coast and Kenya.

Founded by Chude Jideonwo and Adebola Williams, TFP is supervised by a Global Board of Advisors drawn from Africa, Europe, North America and the Middle East, including the Coordinating Minister of the Nigerian Economy, Dr. Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala; Senior Economic Advisor with the Open Society Foundations; Dr. ObiageliEzekwesili, co-founder of ONE, Jamie Drummond and the Chief of Cabinet with the Africa Development Bank, Anne Kabagambe.

Targeting primarily young people between the ages of 16 to 40 years, TFP is guided by a Strategic Plan from which it derives its annual and quarterly work-plan. This report therefore highlights implementation reports comprising overview of implemented activities and results achieved.

2.0 IMPLEMENTED ACTIVITIES ACCORDING TO TFP'S THEMATIC AREAS

2.0.1 Enterprise Development and Employability

The enterprise development thematic area seeks to develop where imperative and also strengthen the capacity of young people in Africa towards positive contribution to the economic and social growth. To this end, the following activities were programmed for implementation in the quarter being reported.

- The Future Project in conjunction with University of Lagos, Faculty of Sciences held its entrepreneurship and leadership conference tagged Beyond the Gate



The Future Project held its annual entrepreneurship and leadership conference in partnership with the University of Lagos, Faculty of Science. The aim of the conference was to groom future leaders that will improve the society and instilling the mind-set of entrepreneurship and leadership in the students.

The programme held in October 21,2014 had in attendance students from various departments and course of study and guests speakers from different fields include, Financial consultant Arese Igwu, Tech expert Zubair Abubakar, PIN Boss Gbenga Sesan, Toke Makinwa, Olushola Amusan of Microsoft Nigeria, Maureen Iyasele of Job Mag and Uche Nnaji of Ouch. A total of 852 participants benefitted from the sessions.

- Aiki Quiz



Aiki quiz was organized for the Aiki employability portal users to test their responsiveness to the site. Questions from the test your English, mock investors pitch and project management sessions of the site were asked also. The Quiz was held twice and had winners from across the country.

- The Future Project partners with Medical Student Association, University of Lagos on its 7th Annual Radiography seminar.



The Future Project in partnership with the Radiography department of the University of Lagos organised a seminar with the topic: Balancing work, pressure and personal life.

The seminar held on the 5th of November, 2014 had in attendance 667 students and speakers from the department and Mrs Nechia Omiyi (Senior Radiographer, Chevron).

In facilitating achievement of the goal, the organization recognizes the importance of identifying with and celebrating young people already demonstrating remarkable leadership skills in their chosen field and also achieving results. The thematic area also focuses on facilitating young people's active, response and informed participation in governance in the country. The Future Awards Africa Aspire Centre 2014



The Aspire Centre is a section of The Future Africa Awards dedicated to inspiring secondary school students towards leadership by direct interaction with the nominees, winners and influencers on the day of the awards.

Part of the activities of the awards was to organize an essay competition amongst secondary school students in Lagos, Nigeria. The students participated in the debate sessions titled "Ebola, The pain, The fear and lessons learnt, using Nigeria as a case study"


-The Future Awards Africa facilitates young people to join the #StopEbola campaign


